



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING HARFORD COMMUNITY COLLEGE & YORK COLLEGE

English, A.A. to English Literary Studies, B.A.


Harford Community College, Bel Air, Maryland, and York College, agree to follow the articulation of courses outlined in the articulation (course equivalency) document, for completion of requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree in English Literary Studies (Attachment A), which is attached to, and incorporated by reference into, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). The following principles guide the operation of this MOU, with the requirements for transfer in specific curricula set forth in Attachment A.

1. York College will accept a maximum number of 74 credits from Harford Community College as outlined in Attachment A. The number of transferable credits specific to this program is reflected in Attachment A.
2. Students who have completed the A.A. degree in English program at Harford Community College may transfer into York College's English Literary Studies program with junior standing provided that the student has completed all courses identified on Attachment A (which is attached to, and incorporated by reference into, this MOU) with a cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher. Courses completed at Harford Community College with 300 or 400 level York College course equivalencies will transfer as lower-level credit but will satisfy course content provided that the student validates the course with a higher level course for which the transferred course is a prerequisite.
3. Only courses in which a grade of C (2.00) or better is earned will apply toward the major at York College.
4. York College will accept the completion of Harford Community College's general education requirements (GenEds) and students will be required to complete courses at York College to satisfy the remaining GenEd requirements as shown in Attachment A.
5. York College recognizes college-level experiential learning gained through previous work, military and/or volunteer service or life experience. Credit for prior learning may also be established through course challenge or standardized credit by examination.
6. Harford Community College students transferring to York College will be given every consideration for financial aid and will be eligible to compete for academic scholarships upon entrance to York College subject to stated scholarship deadlines.
7. Both Harford Community College and York College agree to work together to facilitate the transfer of students from Harford Community College to York College to work

cooperatively to insure the high quality of the programs at the respective institutions. Transfer of students will be in accordance with policies and procedures of both institutions, as they may be amended from time to time.

8. This MOU will be in effect initially for ten years, beginning *fall 2012*, with a review every two years by both parties. Any revisions the parties deem necessary must be evidenced in writing and signed by the authorized officials of each institution. The MOU may be terminated by either party for due cause and after adequate notice of not less than six months is given to the other party.
9. York College will establish procedures to provide information on the academic progress of Harford Community College students enrolled as part of this MOU.
10. This MOU, when signed, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings between the parties respecting the matter hereof.

YORK COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS

1. COMMON CORE: All courses must be completed with a minimum “2.0” grade. Courses may not be taken on a pass/fail basis.

2. ELECTIVE COURSES: (7-9 credits)

3. REQUIRED MAJOR COURSES: (24 credits) - A grade of “2.0” or better is required.

Students are permitted to take no more than one THE or FLM course per literary mode.

A maximum of 75 credits can transfer from Harford Community College. Students must complete the last 30 credit hours at YCP to be eligible for English Literature Major and for graduation. Area Distribution Requirements: A minimum of 12 credits of the Area Distribution Requirements must be at the 200-level or above at York College.
