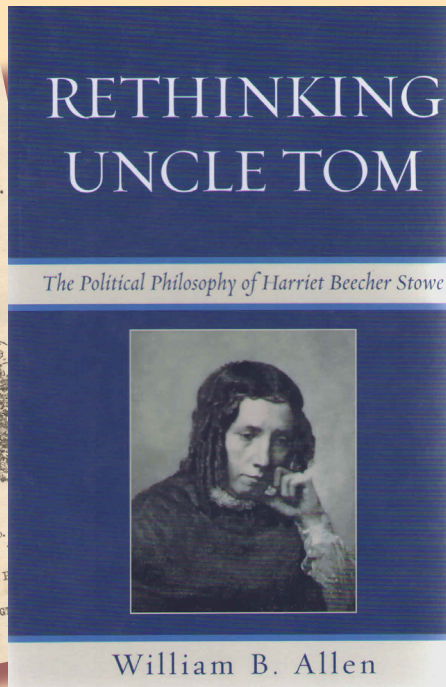
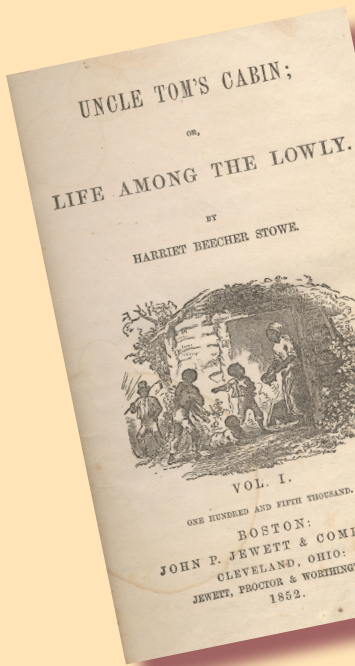

# { Uncle Tom: Exemplar of Freedom }

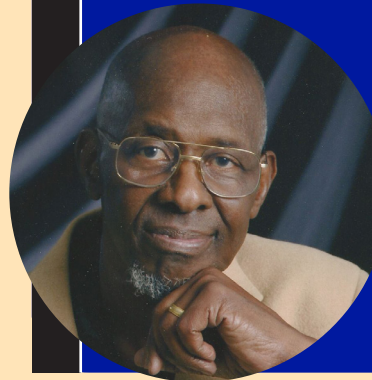
