This film follows Robert and Krishaun, from the South Side of Chicago who dream of graduating from college. Through 5 years of hard work, sacrifice, setbacks and uncertainty, they discover support from family, teachers and mentors makes all the difference in defying the odds.

**The Same Difference-October 11-12:30 PM Student Center Rm. 113**

Examined is the internalized hetero-normative gender roles that have become all too familiar within the African American lesbian and bisexual community and how these behaviors undergird homophobic oppression and masculine privilege of the straight world. Looking for solutions, there is open dialogue about gender roles, performative expectations and silent gender disciplining. Among the voices in the film are Snoop from the Wire and Lea from Orange is The New Black.

**Black in Latin America Mexico and Peru: The Black Grandma in the Closet November 6-12:30 PM Student Center Rm. 113**

Explored is the history of the significant numbers of black people—the two countries together received far more slaves than did the United States —brought to these countries as early as the 16th and 17th centuries, and the culture their descendants created in Vera Cruz on the Gulf of Mexico, the Costa Chica region on the Pacific, and in and around Lima, Peru.

**Dark Girls-November 27-11:30 AM & 1 PM Student Center Rm. 113**

A fascinating and controversial documentary film that explores the prejudices that dark skinned women face throughout the world. It explores the roots of classism, racism and self-esteem within a segment of cultures that span from America to remote corners of the globe. Women share their personal stories, touching on deeply ingrained beliefs and attitudes of society, while allowing generations to heal as they learn to love themselves for who they are.

**STEP-November 28-10:00 AM & 12:00 PM Student Center Rm. 243**

A true story of a girls' high-school step team is set against the background of the heart of Baltimore. These young women learn to laugh, love and thrive - on and off the stage - even when the world seems to work against them. Empowered by their teachers, teammates, counselors, coaches and families, they chase their ultimate dreams: to win a step championship and to be accepted into college.
